The American Association of University Women began in 1881 with 15 college alumnae. Today's supports and members number approximately 170,000.

AUW's mission is to advance gender equity for women and girls through research, education and advocacy.

The Crystal Lake Area branch was organized in 1957 and is one of 38 branches in Illinois.

With more than 1,000 branches and 800 college and university partners, AAUW members across the country contribute to a more promising future for women and girls.

Today's AAUW focuses on Pay Equity, Retirement Security, Gender Equity, Financial Literacy, and Social Justice.

AAUW is a catalyst for change and improving women's lives. AAUW provides grants and fellowships to support educational and professional development for women. AAUW also provides legal advocacy and a support system for women seeking judicial redress for sex discrimination.

Membership
